

As you may be aware we are still having issues trying to find a Lollipop crossing person. Below is a draft letter that we are planning to send, as a school, to our local councillors. You may wish to also send this letter yourselves or discuss this with the prospective candidates for the Town Council elections on 4 May 2017.

#### Dear Councillor

I am writing as a very concerned parent of a child at Christ Church School about pedestrian safety on Bath Road. Safety incidents continue to occur on a regular basis as reported by neighbours, observation evidence by White Stripe and observed by Councillor Pam Hyde, Councillor Martin Newman and Philip Whitehead, Cabinet member for Highways and Transport during a visit made on 9<sup>th</sup> May 2016. Very few of these incidents are reported to the police, so the police statistics are not a reliable guide to levels of safety.

The lack of a satisfactory Lollipop patrol arrangement means that a permanent crossing solution is urgently needed. The number of people crossing easily exceeds the criteria set; the recent Wiltshire Council and School Travel Plan survey of Bath Road concluded that the number crossing far exceeded the 50 minimum. However, it did raise concerns over the precise location of a proposed crossing.

The current provision is inadequate and we are looking for the support of our councillors in developing an improved solution. I am asking that you include this in your election manifesto to show your support of local issues in your constituency.

Thankfully there have been no serious accidents, which is something we all wish to avoid. Many people are taking a different, longer route to school but the pavements are narrow and become part of the road on the blind bend opposite the Rising Sun pub and if faced with coming in the opposite direction someone has to walk into the road, so not a safe route. Wiltshire Council has not provided us with an alternative safe route, despite being asked for one.

One solution would be to put light patrolled crossings on Bath Road where the lollipop crossing patrol currently is and also at the end of Winsley Road. This would solve the roundabout confusion for drivers and provide a warning to drivers that there is a school crossing patrol present. Work could also be undertaken to widen the pavement on the blind bend. Another solution would be to include Bath Road in the 20mph zone during school times.

I look forward to reading your manifesto and seeing some action on this crucial local issue.
