Dear Parents and Carers,

Term 6 is certainly a busy term! With track races and Sports Day, Parents Evenings, our Move Up day, visits for our new starters in September and transition visits for our year 6 leavers as well as the year 6 production!

Last week Year 6 did their own mini general election, which included reading manifestos and making decisions with a confidential vote in their own voting booth. The children demonstrated a number of the school's ELLI principles including; good relationships, reflection and making connections. Year 6 were really enthusiastic about the British value of democracy.

The new building is finally finished and Year 6 have enjoyed moving into the new classrooms. Other classes have also had a tour of the building. We are now wondering what we should call it. If anyone has any suggestions please feel free to let Mr Baker or myself know. The good weather has also arrived. Can I remind you to send the children in with hats and a water bottle, especially for our track races and sports days next week. If you can apply sun cream before the children come to school that would be helpful. The children are expected to be able to apply the sun cream themselves if needed.

Our Kwik Cricket team played in a cluster tournament at Winsley earlier this week and came third. Well done to all who played and thank you to Mr Kiely for supporting them (see picture later in the newsletter).

We must also say thank you to FOCCS for purchasing us a new microphone and a special thank you to Mrs Carey who very kindly came at short notice to set it up so we could use it for the Year 1 collective worship last week.

Today the governors have spent the day in school sharing in our learning and lunchtimes as well as supporting the school with its self evaluation and school improvement plan for this year. We welcome our two new parent governors, Graham Adams and Amy Laird.

On a sad note many of the Year 1 children are very disappointed that they are unable to use some of their wonderful outside resources that were purchased with FOCCS cake day money. This is because before and after school a number of unsupervised toddlers have used sticks to scratch the new board purchased earlier this year and some outside scales have also been broken. The children regularly use this equipment but are unable to use it as often as they would like. It can't be left out because of the unsupervised children that have been damaging it before and after school.

On a more positive note I am pleased to say that FOCCS has raised the money for a school radio station. There have been a few questions about how this might benefit all the children across the school. The radio station we intend to purchase is a portable one so it will not only have it's own studio but also be able to be moved to class-room locations to be used by a whole class. The National Curriculum introduced in 2014 has a number of objectives which promote speaking aloud, reading children's own work, performing poetry, as well as script writing. The radio station would allow the children to do this in a real life context and give purpose to their written work and performances as well as giving them an audience. Many children often don't have the confidence to speak out loud in front of a whole group of people, yet research shows a radio allows these children to build up confidence and perform to an audience. We hope in the first year to produce recorded podcasts and sound clouds that can be uploaded to the website so friends and family will be able to hear the radio shows. Then when we are ready we will broadcast live radio shows. We have also been in contact with a local broadcaster who we hope will support the children.

A fabulous evening is planned and we look forward to seeing you there.










