After the Easter break we will be welcoming Mrs Nicola Screen to Christ Church to teach Music and we will have more information at the start of next term about the clubs that Mrs Screen will be running at lunchtimes.

We have also had our fabulous Foundation Moosical this term, There's a Sunflower in my Supper! The children all performed brilliantly. We were very impressed with their skills in singing, dancing and acting and we hope their parents enjoyed it too.


Ava Snow (3LM) has passed her level 4 Trampoline award. Congratulations Ava!


