Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach the end of this academic year we have lots to celebrate. This newsletter will show off a culmination of all the work that has happened over the course of this term. This has included many trips with foundation enjoying Bristol Zoo and Year 2 enjoying Longleat. KS1 and Foundation also enjoyed their circus day as a treat for all their hard work following their marble jar explosion. KS2 have enjoyed a variety of different topics from Brazil in Year 5 finishing with a carnival and Year 3 going back in time to enjoy a history day. Meanwhile Year 6 have entertained us with their musical production of Alice in Wonderland. They all performed brilliantly and showed off their musical and acting talent like professionals. Many thanks to all the staff, parents and volunteers who supported the children and helped them create such an amazing show. I would also like to take the opportunity to thank all the year 6s for their hard work over the years and wish them well with the next chapter of their school career.

This term particularly has allowed the pupils to focus on our newly introduced ELLUI dimension of being independent. Each year group has allowed the children to take on their own independent project. I have been really impressed with the quality of work the children have produced as well as using many other ELLI dimensions to support their independence, including their curious minds and creativity.

Many thanks must go to FOCCS for all their hard work and support this year. They have raised an amazing £21,155, which is absolutely fantastic! This money makes a big difference to the school. Over the past year they have purchased £250 worth of books for every year group, bought KS1 a new reading scheme, provided money for materials for Arts Week, paid for lunchtime sports clubs, bought two replacement microphones for the hall, paid for World Book Day author visits, supported the KS1 Nativity and Year 6 production and provided money for Emotional Literacy resources. We have also raised £10,000 to allow the school to purchase a radio station. Not to mention some of the wonderful things each year group has purchased with their own cake day money. Next year they intend to raise money to look at the school grounds and are putting a working party together for the project. There is a meeting about this on 21 September 2017. Thank you all for all your contributions.

We are saying goodbye to Mrs Jenny Knight, Music teacher, and Mrs Elaine Olasz, Learning Support Assistant and we wish them all the best for the future. Mrs Kate Brown will be taking a year's sabbatical and we look forward to her returning in September 2018. As we say goodbye we also need to welcome new staff. Mrs Sara Taylor will be joining us in

September as Music teacher and Mrs Sarah Robinson will be joining the Foundation team as class teacher for Hedgehogs. I am sure you will join with me in welcoming them to the Christ Church community.

May I take this opportunity to thank all the parents, governors and staff for their support while I have been Interim Head and wish you all a lovely summer break.

The work has meant that Christ Church has been in a position to know at the outset the national discussion around the future of schools—especially changes to schools funding (as I write this, new funding has just been announced—we await the finer details).

I would like to take this opportunity to publicly thank Mrs Hann-Perkins for her professionalism and hard work whilst taking on the Interim Headship. I would also like to thank you, as parents, for your continued support too. Below you will find the response to the parents questionnaire given out at the parent teacher consultations. The question regarding school meals was added to the other 'Ofsted' questions. Most of the respondents who disagreed with the statement explained their reasons. It was either to do with the portion size for Upper KS2 pupils or what is being offered as a pudding, or the amount of sugar in the meals offered. All of these issues have already been discussed with Sodexo who have responded positively. I will ask them to officially respond in the new academic year.

End of Phase Data Results

Listed below are the results from the national tests undertaken this year. This is excellent data for the end of the year. The school's data is currently un-validated but we are pleased with our outcomes.

Early Years Foundation Stage—Good Level of Development

85.2% (National 2017 = 70.7%) (Wiltshire = 70.3%)

Year 1 Phonics

91.5% (National Average 2016 = 81%) (Wiltshire = 81.2%)

KS1 (Year 2) Expected standard or above

Reading 83.3% (National Average 2016 = 74%) Writing 73.3% (National Average 2016 = 60%) Mathematics 76.7% (National Average 2016 = 73%)

KS2 (Year 6) Expected standard or above

Reading 85% (National Average 2017 = 71%) (Wiltshire = 72.2%) Writing 72% (National Average 2017 = 76%) (Wiltshire = 58.5%) Mathematics 83.3% (National Average 2017 = 75%) (Wiltshire = 71.9%) Reading, Grammar and Mathematics 70% (National Average 2017 = 61%) (Wiltshire = 58.5%)

The school is pleased with the attainment results and recognises there are some areas we still need to work on. This will form part of the school's improvement plan for 2017/2018.
