Weekly Routines

Daily – We will ask the children to bring their reading books and learning logs daily. If your child uses a rucksack, please provide a separate flat folder to protect books and enable easy access from the locker. Mondays – Spellings will be checked each Monday, so please ensure your child brings his/her booklet in *every* Monday morning. If your child is ready to be tested, please sign and date the back page.

<u>PE</u>

PE will take place on Monday afternoon and Wednesday morning. As we go into the Autumn, please make sure your child has a pair of warm trousers for PE as well as shorts, a PE jumper and a short sleeved top. If your child has long hair, please ensure it is tied up.

Morning Starters

From 8.40am, the children will be involved in short activities to practise key Maths and English skills, so they need to be in school as promptly as possible.

Don't forget that your child does not need to bring in a snack as we will be providing a piece of fruit or vegetable each morning.

Where the Wild Things Are Year 2, Term 1

Our topic this term focuses on habitats around the world and the flora and fauna that live in them. Science, Geography and English will be the main topic drivers as we will learn about the diet, habitats and life cycles of various mammals, birds, fish, reptiles and amphibians. The topic will be crosscurricular and will also involve art skills (collage and colour mixing) as well as Dance and Music ('The Carnival of the Animals' by Saint Saens).

Supporting your child at home this year

You can play a significant part in your child's learning by supporting them at home. There are three areas where we particularly need your help:

- Please aim to read every day with your child at home. Research has shown that when children read extensively, they become better writers. Reading a variety of genres helps children learn text structures and language that they can then transfer to their own writing. In addition, reading provides children with prior knowledge that they can use in their stories.
- Please help your child learn their spellings. The children will continue to learn spellings as part of the whole school spelling system and will bring home a booklet. Your child will need support learning and embedding these spellings so they are committed to long-term memory.
- A good recall of number facts and fluency in mental skills will give your child confidence with Maths.
 Please support your child to add 2 numbers below 10, for example by playing games with dice. Later in Term 2, the children will start our school times tables system, at which point we will send you more information about the progression of skills.
