

Hooray! We are back to school at last, for an adventure into the world of the Mayan civilisation. This History based topic will see us exploring aspects of Mayan society, customs and culture and will culminate in a Mayan feast at the end of term 1. Very exciting!

In our English and topic learning we shall be comparing the Mayan society with other important historical, fictional and future societies, using a range of film, textual and visual sources to inspire our writing and creative thinking. The main focus here will be on writing effective descriptions, building atmosphere and tension and exploring a range of new sentence types to heighten our reader's excitement.

Our art lessons will delve into the patterns, colours and textures of Mayan culture, using our knowledge to construct a fabulous Mayan face mask as our final piece at the end of term, whilst Computing will see us creating a maze-based game using Scratch.

In our Maths learning we will be focusing on place value, addition & subtraction, geometry and statistics, as well as improving our ability to explore possibilities and find patterns and rules in number Stunning civilisations

If your child is struggling to find a book they enjoy, we are more than happy to give recommendations and advice!

Children need to remember their spelling country booklets every Tuesday to be signed off. Please ensure that you have also signed to show where they have practised that week.

Finally, 40 minutes should be spent on the topic/maths/English homework each week. We will have discussed the expectations and content with the children beforehand, so they should be able to carry this out independently, or with minimal help.
