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What was Bradford-on-Avon like 100 years ago?

Our Topic learning this term will explore what life was like in Bradford-on-Avon 100 years ago, looking at the role of women, food and rationing, and geographical differences. As we work towards an independent project based on an aspect of Bradford-on-Avon's history, we will be visiting the Museum to conduct our own research. Any independent research that the children wish to do at home, about their own area or even their own families, is very welcome!

English: we will be looking at story-writing from different perspectives, poetry from World War I, and playscripts, spending some time looking at the play 'Archie Dobson's War'.

Maths: we will be focussing on fractions, percentages, ratio and geometry as we get to grips with pie charts.

Science: we will investigate the way that light travels and reflects to help us to create our own periscopes.

Art: we will look at the work of ceramic artists Paul Cummins and Tom Piper to inspire our own installation of clay poppies.
