The geography focus will see us comparing major world rivers, examining the water cycle and how rivers are formed, naming the parts of rivers and how to locate them in the world with increasingly complex grid references. The topic culminates in a study of our own beautiful river Avon as we go for a field trip...hooray!

What are we learning?

Maths: We will be: solidifying calculation methods in multiplication and adding, subtracting and multiplying fractions, problem solving and real-life contexts for place value, interpreting tables, charts and graphs, properties of shapes and angles in shapes.

English: Our focus will be on: examining how authors create atmosphere and build character images, our own descriptions of rivers and water, information booklets and short stories.

Geography: During topic we will look at the parts of rivers, comparing rivers of the world, the water cycle, local river study.

Art: We will be taking a closer look at perspective and vanishing points, including a local study.

PSHEE: As part of this unit, we are examining strategies for dealing with things that embarrass us, changes in our bodies and how to cope with change.

Science: Life cycles of living creatures, tracing the changes of animals as they mature, flow diagrams and close observational drawings to demonstrate understanding of how animals change over time, reproduction and parts of flowers.
