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Thank you for all the support you are providing at home. This really does make a difference to your child's progress in school. Our TOP TIPS to supporting your child with their homework are:

- Reading aloud and having lots of discussion about books are vital to help your child develop fluency, expression and comprehension skills. Please continue to record all the reading you do at home with your child in their Reading Log. Record everything you read together; we are really encouraging the children to read different genres so read the newspaper together, magazines, information books, comic strips like Asterix or Tintin, or other graphic novels.
- Times tables We will continue to support the children with their tables in class but regular practice with an adult at home is invaluable. You can check where your child is working by looking at the Learning Log. Continue your fabulous work on TT Rockstars.
- Spellings Please keep practising with those spellings too. Don't forget to log into Spelling Shed for extra practice.
- Flipped Classroom. There may be a prelearning homework for a future lesson usually reading through some information or some research. Children will have a week to complete this flipped classroom homework. The day it is given out will depend on when it's needed for. It won't necessarily be every week.

This term our learning skills-based reward system will again focus on our school's ELLI philosophy: co-operation, creativity, reflection, making connections, resilience, learnability, independence and curiosity. When the children display one of these skills, they will be rewarded with a small national flag which they will place on their very own little globe.

Please note, PE sessions will take place on Friday afternoon and Thursday mornings. Your child will need a T-shirt, shorts, trainers and a sweatshirt for outdoor PE, and jogging trousers will also be necessary as winter draws in. Please be aware that long hair will need to be tied back and earrings taped or removed for these sessions. Remember that children should come dressed in their PE kits on a Thursday.
