Reading and Writing

- Please can you ensure that your child's reading book is in school every day with their reading log and tricky word cards. Please aim to read daily with your child at home and record in their reading log, a quick comment or an initial will do. We do read your comments as we change books so they are useful to us. Please be aware that we keep our own records in school so we do not record in the log every time we hear your child read.
- Please remember to put your child's reading book and log book into the box when you feel they are ready to change them. We would recommend reading the same text 2 or 3 times until they can read with speed and fluency.
- Keep practicing the phase 3 digraphs and trigraphs from the folders. The children need to be able to apply their knowledge to read and write words and sentences.
- Continue to practice tricky words. These are so important in improving the children's fluency when reading.
- This term we will be concentrating on learning how to read and write consonant blends in words for example the <u>st</u> in <u>st</u>op or ne<u>st</u>. We will send home more information as the term progresses.
