

SIAMS Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (Section 48)

The purpose of SIAMS inspection is:

- to provide an evaluation of the impact of the school's distinctively Christian vision for the governing body, the school, the parents, the diocese, the Church of England Education Office and the wider public
- to meet the requirements of Section 48 of the Education Act 2005 for schools which have a religious character
- to verify the outcome of the school's self evaluation
- to make a significant contribution to the improvement and sustainability of church schools.

NEXT STEPS

Three action points built into an action plan to be addressed within the next 5 years.



Class collective worship – where the children celebrate their learning and is open to parents and relatives. Following the presentation the children come and share their work with their visitors.

House Day – a time when the children are placed in their house teams and vertically grouped from Y1 (occasionally FS) through to Y6. They take part in a whole school theme.

Parent teacher consultations – an opportunity to book a time to meet with the classteacher.

It could be to discuss 'reports' or how your child is settling in.

Bookings are made through ParentMail

KS2 SATS – Statutory Assessment Tests for the pupils at the end of their primary years (Y6)

Sports Day and competitive track races – track races are competitive. Parents are invited to the afternoon.

Sports Day is a 'round robin' of skill based events where points are collected for their house. Some events count for an overall winner.

Parents and family are invited for the afternoon.

Welcome meetings – meetings held by your child's new classteacher for the next academic year.
