# Rivers and Journeys

### What are we learning about?

In **maths** we will be focussing on fractions including; multiplying whole numbers and fractions, finding equivalent fractions, simplifying fractions and linking fractions, decimals and percentages.

In **English** and **guided reading** we will be studying the text Kensuke's Kingdom and will be focussing on descriptive and persuasive writing. If you haven't previously read the book, please refrain from doing so as we will be reading it as a class.

In **science** we will be considering the differences in the life cycles of mammals, amphibians, insects and birds and describing the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.

In our **PSHEE** sessions, we will be thinking about relationships with ourselves and in the online community.

In computing we will be looking at data collection and the impact of data in the real world.

In **RE** we will be exploring Hinduism and thinking about the key question: Do beliefs in Karma, Samsara and Moksha help Hindus lead good lives?

In **PE** we are very excited to be learning the skills involved ultimate frisbee with Miss B and Mr P, whilst Mr Kiely will be helping us with our athletics skills.

#### **General information**

During Term 5, our PPA day will be on a **Tuesday**. The children will need to come to school wearing their PE kits on both **Tuesdays** and **Thursdays**.
