Dear Parents and Carers,

Parents Evening – Tuesday 29 June and Wednesday 30 June 2021

I mentioned in previous correspondence that I would write regarding parent teacher consultations. Below is the outline of how the event will take place. I would like to start by saying that we were looking forward to using this event as a way of celebrating the school year. However, recent announcements from the government have resulted in new guidance being issued, so we can no longer carry out what was planned. I am sure you will share our frustrations.

However, the consultations will still be able to take place in person in one of the classrooms assigned to the year group. All the teachers from the year group will be in one classroom sitting at opposite ends of the room. They will be seated behind a screen. We ask, that as parents, you wear a face covering. The consultation will be to discuss the report that will be sent by post the week before the consultations take place.

In order to keep the crowds down we ask that you only enter the building at your allocated time. Teachers will need to be strict on their allocated times to ensure there are no queues. An appointment will be 10 minutes long.

You will be able to book your appointment on Parentmail with effect from 9.00am on 21 June 2021. The appointments will start at 4.00pm and the last appointment will be at 6.50pm. If you are not comfortable with a face to face appointment then we ask that you still book an appointment through the system and then email (admin@chritchurch.wilts.sch.uk) to ask that this appointment will be a telephone call.

Please do not enter the site if you have any of the COVID-19 symptoms:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)

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• a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

If you have to move to different locations we ask that you move on the outside of the buildings. The classrooms have been chosen because they are near outside doors. The corridors are likely to be closed off.

I am immensely proud of the way everyone has managed the new restrictions and supported our policies. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the children, staff and you as parents for our joint commitment in trying to keep everyone safe.
