
Okay, so you might have gathered that our topic this term is all about extreme weather. In our **Geography** learning we will be investigating major weather events from the last 50 years, from flooding in Bradford-on-Avon to hurricanes, tornadoes and blizzards across the world. Our work in **English** will centre around Shakespeare's *The Tempest*, which will also be our production. Expect to spend lots of time practising songs, making props, running your lines, and designing tickets and flyers as we stage our very own show!

Our work in **Computing** will see us use iMovie to create our own weather reports about extreme weather events, adding sound effects and titles, whilst in **Science** we will run a series of investigations to recap some important learning from the last couple of years. In **Maths**, we will take on the role of travel agents to run a project that applies lots of our learning to an exciting new context, and in **RE** we will be looking at the big question 'Does belief in life after death help a Muslim to lead a good life?' As our **PSHEE** learning covers the topics of Relationships and Changes, look out for a letter giving you more information about what we will be covering this term. In **PE** we will be doing lots of cricket and rounders, as is traditional for the last term of Year 6 – but will also be adding in the less traditional sport of Ultimate Frisbee for the first time!

This term is going to be exciting but very busy, and we want to give you every opportunity to make the most of the experiences on offer.
