<u>Specific Individual Learning</u> <u>Support</u>



My name is Hilary Mobbs. I work in the Learning Lodge at Christ Church alongside the Inclusion Team to support children who may need additional support with Maths, Reading or Writing. I can provide individualised programmes of support with the guidance of the school SENCo to help children move forward and feel more confident in their academic achievement. Programmes of support usually run for 6-8weeks. If it is felt your child would benefit from these sessions, then you will be contacted by the SENCo or your childs class teacher.

Speech and Language Support



My name is Sally Robertson, and I am a Speech and Language Learning Support Assistant. I work, in school, with children who have been identified by the Speech and Language Service as having specific areas of Speech, Language or Communication need.

Following targets, set by the Speech and Language Therapists, children have regular 1:1 or small group sessions throughout the week. There is close liaison between School, Parents and the Speech and Language Therapists so that we can all work together to help support your child.

I have had the following training: ELKLAN - Speech and Language Support for Verbal children with ADS (Level 3); Supporting Children with Communication Impairments in the Mainstream Classroom; MAKATON Beginners Workshop and I have a Postgraduate qualification in Psychology. Most importantly, I am learning new things from your brilliant children every day!





Hello, my name is Sonia Paton. I am the Emotional Literacy Support Assistant at Christ Church. My aim is to help children remove barriers to learning in order that children can be happy in school and at home.

In ELSA sessions children will have the opportunity to talk about their feelings and carry out planned activities to support their emotional needs.

If the Inclusion Team feel that a child needs my support them, I will be in contact with you by letter explaining what the sessions will focus on. Support usually takes the form of one session a week for 6-8 weeks. Please see separate ELSA leaflet for more information about the support I can provide.

I work closely with the Child and Family Support worker and SENCo so please contact them through the school office if you wish to discuss ELSA Support.
