### Peripatetic Music lessons

A message from Mrs Screen: We are delighted to announce that we will be welcoming back visiting instrumental teachers from the start of Term 6.

Learning an instrument has so many benefits for children. As well as the enjoyment and opportunities that playing an instrument brings, it helps with brain development, memory recall and retention as well as so many transferable skills that are essential for lifelong learning.

All of our visiting teachers are Wiltshire Music Connect Associates and offer high quality tuition as well as holding enhanced DBS. As a school, we facilitate the lessons by providing space and time for the instrumental teachers to visit the school. However the cost of tuition lies with parents / carers, and fees will vary from teacher to teacher. Children in receipt of Pupil Premium funding are eligible to have their lessons fully subsidised, and may also be able to receive support with the cost of instrument hire. Instrumental teachers will liaise directly with parents regarding fees and pupil progress, and will be able to answer any questions regarding cost.

We can already confirm that we will be welcoming teachers of piano and guitar from the start of Term 6. Our drum teacher is also looking to start back as soon as possible but more than likely from term 1.
