Dear Friends,
Monday 26th February is a big day in the life of our four churches and communities. We look forward to this much anticipated day as Revd. Katie Jackson is licensed and installed as our Rector of North Bradford and Villages, and we welcome her, together with her lovely family Rob, Matty and Lottie.


Christ Church will be bursting with friends from St Mary's Broughton Gifford, All Saints Great Chalfield, and St Katharine's Holt where Katie has served her curacy, as well as representatives from the wider church, our Bishop, Archdeacon and Rural Dean, and of course parishioners from our four churches and communities here. The service starts at 7 pm , and you are advised to allow time to find somewhere to park thoughtfully. (Please share transport if you can.)


The institution service of a new rector is a great occasion. It's called the celebration of new ministry, and for me one thing stands our loud and clear. Although the focus will be upon Katie and her ministry among us, this ministry is shared with us all.

During the service she will be led symbolically first to the font, then to the lectern and pulpit, and finally to the altar as signs of the ministry entrusted to her...but at each point she will ask us: Will you share with me in the ministry of making new disciples to which we are called together?... Will you share with me in the regular study and proclamation of God's word that together we may bring the light of faith to a dark world, kindle the fire of love in a cold world, and open the door of hope in a tired world?... Will you share regularly with me in this Sacrament of Holy Communion, that we may grow in unity and love?


We're in this together!
As she is handed the bishop's licence of authority, he will say the awesome words "Receive this cure of souls which is both yours and mine." It's important that we offer Katie our love and prayers as she settles in over the coming weeks and months. She will need space and freedom to be herself, so that she may exercise this cure of souls in a sustainable way for her and for us all.


Over the past ten months we have been collectively praying: Almighty God, we give you thanks for the many people and places that make up this part of the body of Christ. As we work together to make Jesus known in the communities we serve, we look to you for all that we need. Keep us faithful, generous and united in our love for you and each other as we prepare for a new beginning. Give us courage to follow you with hope and joy in our hearts. May we be open to change and ready graciously to welcome our new Rector, Katie, on whom we now pray your blessing. Amen.
