

Dear Friends

'All good gifts around us are sent from heaven above'

These words, taken from the well known harvest hymn "We plough the fields and scatter", are a great reminder that there is always something to give thanks for. As we approach the season of harvest festivals, we give thanks for the food that we enjoy and those who provide it, especially our farmers and shop assistants.

Surrounded by farms, as we are, how often do we take for granted all that the farming community does: the long hours, the hard physical work in all weather conditions to ensure that we have food on our tables. As the Farming Community Network (FCN: a Christian ecumenical voluntary organisation) states,

"We have beautiful landscape in this country that has been shaped by centuries of farmers producing food for the urban populations. We eat because of them, we can enjoy our rural environment because of them and we can marvel at nature partly because of their work."

So to any farmers reading this: Thank you for your time, talents and care of our land.

But as we enjoy the fruits of harvest, we are also reminded that for some people both in our communities and further afield, cupboards are empty and stomachs are hungry. Equally the farming life can be very tough (suicide among farmers is proportionally more prevalent than among members of any other profession).

Harvest thanksgiving is not just something we should do at our churches around the country, but it should also impact on how we act. Having a heart of thankfulness compels us to reach out to bless others and to share what we have freely and generously. One way we can do this is to support the work of the Hub, by bringing donations of food, not just at harvest time but whenever we are able to. We can also support through money or prayer the work of the FCN which offers support to farmers through difficult seasons in their lives. However we choose to live out our thanksgiving, thank you.



For those whose lives are caught up with your creation, and who work with you in tending and

nurturing it; those who even now suffer as a result of the

crisis in our countryside;
those afraid for their future, those struggling

all whose livelihood and existence is under threat.
