

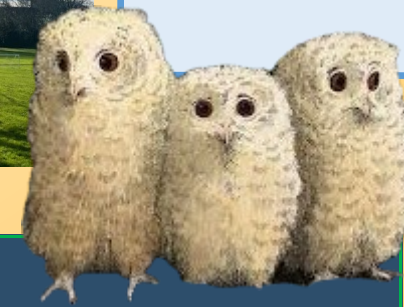
Dark Nights, Bright Lights

Lesson Focus and Key Questions

Exploring our school grounds in the Winter, discussing what we notice about the season. Discovering and finding out about the sun. Following instructions to make bird feeders and finding out what animals we may see in the day.

Light Sources
What other light sources do we use in our everyday lives? Where do we get the power from to turn on lights and torches?
Reflective Materials What makes a material reflective? We will investigate and sort different materials

Shadows We will learn that shadows form when something is blocking out the light. We will have fun making shadow art!



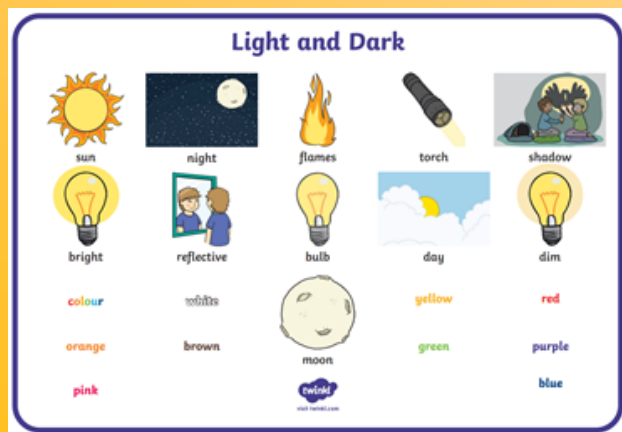
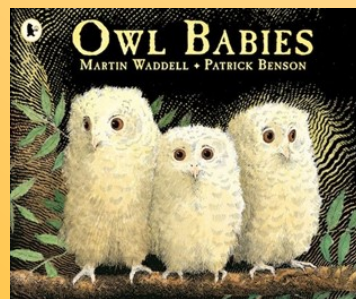
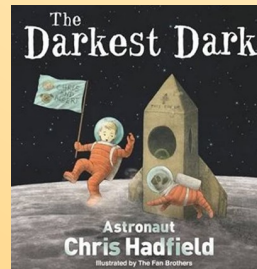
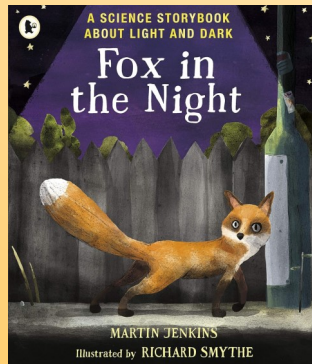
Nocturnal Animal

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Sun	The Sun is a star found at the centre of our solar system. It gives Earth Light and heat.
Moon	This is a rocky dusty place. It is Earth's natural satellite
Nocturnal	Nocturnal animals are active during the night time and sleep in the day.
Shadow	A shadow is formed when something blocks the light.
Silhouette	A shadows' outline is called a silhouette
Reflective	A reflective material is often smooth and shiny. It reflects the light
Electricity	Electricity is a form of energy, it can power things such as torches and light bulbs.
