



Dear Friends

Lent is the church's particular time for encouraging us on our journey to grow together and individually to a mature faith, deepening our trust in our Lord Jesus Christ (Ephesians 4 v11-15; Colossians 1 v 2-29; 2 Peter 3 v18; 1 Timothy 4 v15 – but no showing off!) It is not a competition in godliness even if St Paul does write about 'a race'.

Here are some suggestions for making Lent an interesting, enriching and even enjoyable time, when we deepen our Christian faith and prepare to celebrate Easter. My hope is that the suggestions will trigger other ideas that are best suited to you. I recommend a variety of choices as God is concerned for all aspects of our lives; also that we are cautious and don't take on more than is manageable.

What I particularly like about Lent is that it is a limited period when 'compound interest' (as I like to call it) can be very effective and enriching. Although it is often thought of as a time for giving things up, for abstinence from things we enjoy (which has its place), I prefer to emphasise the value of Lent as a time to take on new experiences.

Some of these suggestions will already be part of your regular practice, others might be unrealistic, but some might be worth a thought or, as I say, trigger something else that is more suited to you. So, in no particular order, how about during Lent:

- Write a letter or make a phone call to someone that you've been meaning to contact but never got around to (it can be very satisfying to do so)
- Read Mark's gospel in one go or two if needed – it doesn't take as long as you might imagine and provides an inspiring picture of the life of Jesus
- Attend a church service that you rarely or never go to – eg Compline which will be weekly on Wednesdays at 6pm throughout Lent or perhaps a Holy Week service
- Ensure you have a fun day out or an evening treat during Lent (Jesus was not always available and enjoyed a good party or meal)
- Pray every day for the same particular person or situation that is on your heart
- Sit in silence for ten minutes once a week, simply repeating the word 'Jesus' or a short scriptural phrase such as 'the Lord's my shepherd'; when your mind wanders, gently return to your word
- Make a point of talking with someone at church whom you don't normally talk to
- Go without a meal once a week and accumulate the money saved and give it to a charity
- Attend the Benefice Quiet Morning that Rev Tessa is leading
- Join a House Group or link up with a few friends to read a Christian book together (if you need a book suggestion then ask around for ideas, the clergy are quite a good resource)
- Go for a walk with someone and share how your Christian faith has unfolded or simply celebrate God's creation (it's springtime)

If this way of approaching Lent appeals to you, then I suggest you make a short list of your Lenten intentions. If, like me, you slip up and forget to do an intention, just be gentle with yourself, life isn't neat and things happen to derail us; just pick up again and continue – remember, it isn't a competition.

I always find that as the days of Lent go by the intentions that can be repeated have a beneficial cumulative effect, which is what I call 'compound interest'. Those of you who have experience of Home Groups will know what I mean. However you embrace Lent I hope and pray that it will be a period of blessing for all of us.


